

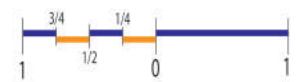

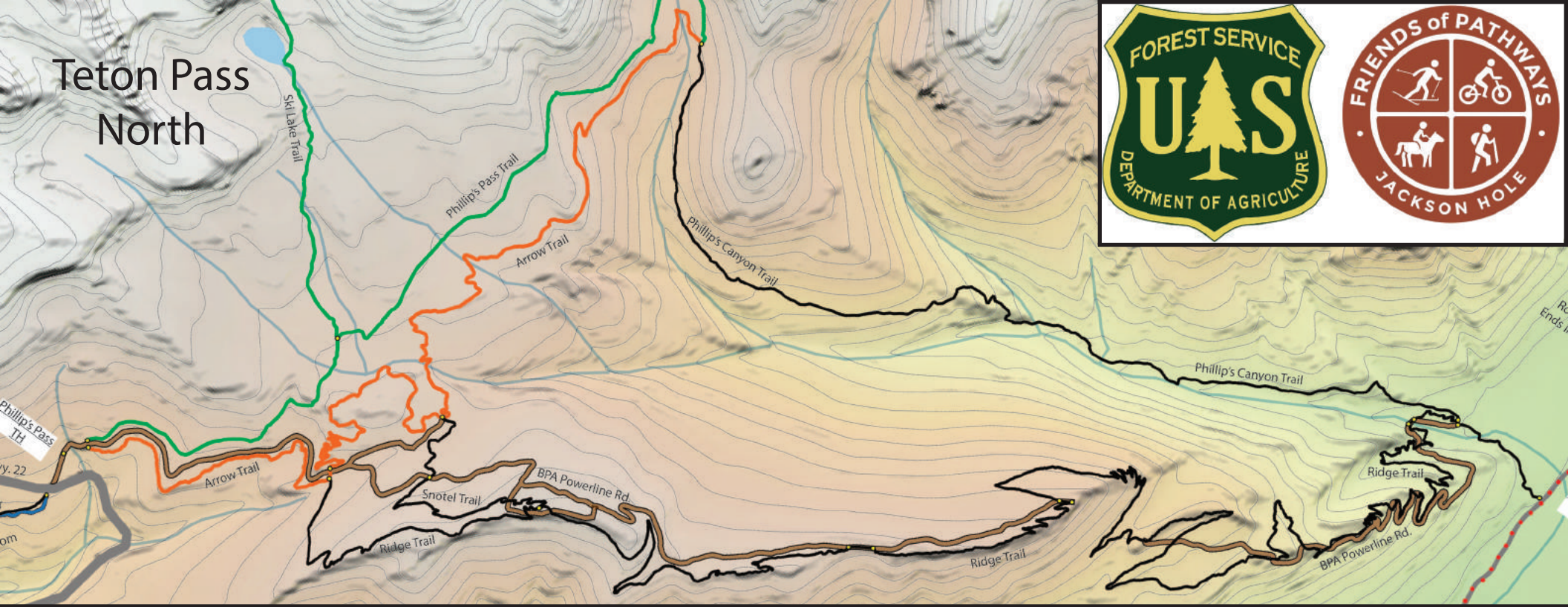
Pick Up Your Dog's Poop
